Approximately every twenty years the City-County Planning Board develops an Area Plan for each neighborhood to serve as a guide in future land use and public investment decisions. The planning staff has begun the initial data collection for the neighborhoods north and east of Silas Creek Parkway, south of Business 40, and west of Peters Creek Parkway. The area includes the Ardmore, Hanestown, and Biltmore neighborhoods.

Citizen participation is a critical part of the Area Plan process. Please join your neighbors and the city planning staff at the Southwest Winston-Salem Vision Meeting to tell the city what you want your neighborhood to be like in the future.

Grab your running shoes and canned goods and join us for this year's Ardmore 5K race, one mile fun run and food drive benefiting Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC on Saturday, October 18. The starting gun will go off at 8:30 a.m. for the fun run

and 9 a.m. for the 5K.

Ardmore residents have a true sense of community and generosity, and we're hoping that will translate into overflowing bins of nonperishable foods. We'll have collection bins at Redeemer Presbyterian Church on Miller Street and at several of our sponsors' locations leading up
